



COMPARE WRITERS' PROGRAMME

January 26-27, 2016 The University of the Philippines, Diliman

The Comparative Education Society of Asia (CESA) and the Comparative Education Society of the Philippines (CESP), in collaboration with BAICE/*Compare* and with support from UNGEI are offering a writing for publication programme for researchers in South East Asia working in the field of educational research and gender. The programme consists of a workshop and a follow-up programme during which participants work towards submitting an article to *Compare* with the help of mentors. The workshop will be held on January 26-27, 2016 at the University of the Philippines, Diliman, immediately before the CESA conference.

The Workshop

During the workshop, you will work on key features of academic journal articles, look at submitted and revised papers and have the chance to discuss the expectations and interests of *Compare* with one of *Compare*'s current editors. The workshop will be facilitated by Dr Anna Magyar (University of East Anglia) who has many years' experience of teaching academic writing for publication and has been running the programme since its inception 9 years ago. This is a unique opportunity to receive individualised support with your writing and gain an insider perspective on publishing in *Compare* (a journal of comparative and international education).

The Programme

The *Compare* Writers' Programme is aimed at researchers, established or new academics in the South who have no or little experience of successfully publishing in international, peer-reviewed journals. The programme offers a unique opportunity to receive individualised support in writing and submitting a research article.

The Participants

The *Compare* Writers' Programme in South East Asia will bring together around 20 to 25 participants, primarily from the Philippines, Vietnam, Lao, Cambodia, Indonesia and elsewhere in the region, though it is also open to other participants from Asia. The participant group will include a mix of young academicians from Universities as well as established researchers and practitioners working in the field of education and development, with rich field experiences and lacking opportunities to translate them into academic writings.

Funding

With support from UNGEI, part or full-financing will be offered to some of the participants for participation in the workshop.
